**Research:**

Briones, P., (2014- present). (Co-investigator) *Hemodialysis Access Surveillance Evaluation (HASE) Study*. Hemodialysis vascular access dysfunction contributes directly to morbidity and mortality and adds to the cost of medical care of dialysis patients. A surveillance approach of arteriovenous fistulas or arteriovenous grafts is recommended by the National Kidney Foundation Disease Outcomes Quality Initiative (KDOQI). The purpose of this study is to evaluate the impact of using ultrasound dilution technique (UDT) (Transonic) as surveillance on vascular access thrombosis, cumulative access patency, need for tunneled hemodialysis catheters and hospitalization in patients on chronic hemodialysis. The study is a randomized prospective multicenter clinical trial to evaluate whether monthly surveillance flow measurement using Transonic system or physical examination of the arteriovenous access by a qualified person (nurse) will reduce the rate of thrombosis. The intervention will take place at least once a month. This study is currently in progress with 206 patients enrolled at 5 centers. This study is funded by Transonic for \$330,000. Date of expected completion is 2019.

Briones, P. (2014). (Principal Investigator). *Examination of Vaccination Rates in an Outpatient Hemodialysis Facility*. Study consisted of a retrospective chart review of 133 patients using University of Miami and the DaVita Miami dialysis unit records from August 1, 2012 to July 31, 2013. The purpose of this study was to evaluate the rate of CDC recommended adult immunizations among prevalent hemodialysis patients in an outpatient unit. This study demonstrated a large disparity between the frequencies of the HAV, Tdap, and herpes zoster immunizations to influenza, HBV, and pneumococcal in patients in one outpatient dialysis unit. Relevance to practice: improving immunization rates for HAV, HBV, pneumococcal, Tdap, influenza, and zoster is a simple, yet underutilized intervention, which could assist, in improving rates of disability, morbidity, and mortality in this immunocompromised population.
